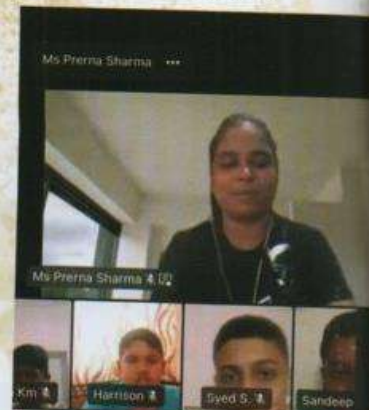
Resilience Based Orientation Programme

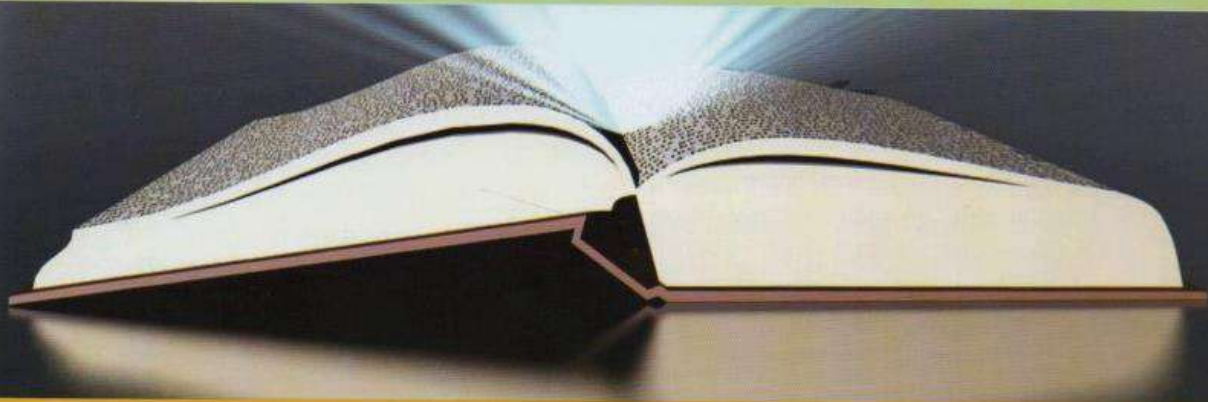
Technology During the Pandemic

शिक्षा के क्षेत्र में कोरोना महामारी का परिणाम

विद्यार्थी जीवन में ऑनलाइन शिक्षा आज बहुत महत्वपूर्ण अंग बन गई है। क्योंकि आज किसी कारणवश विद्यालय बंद रहे तो, इस समय ऑनलाइन शिक्षा ही शिक्षा प्राप्त करने का एकमात्र साधन रहा है। भारत के स्कूलों में मार्च में परीक्षाएं हो जाती हैं और अप्रैल में फिर नई कक्षाएं शुरू हो जाती हैं। लेकिन स्कूल बंद होने के कारण इस बार बच्चों की पढ़ाई नहीं हो पाई है। इस समस्या का खासकर प्राइवेट स्कूलों ने डिजिटल माध्यम से बच्चों को शिक्षा देने का उपाय निकाला था। जिससे बच्चे घर बैठकर मोबाइल उपकरण से पढ़ाई पूरी कर सके। लेकिन जो पढ़ाई स्कूल में जाकर होती है; वह ऑनलाइन से नहीं हो पाती क्योंकि ऑनलाइन में हमें नेटवर्क, अनचाहे वीडियो से दिक्कत हो रही थी। फिर भी बड़ी मुश्किल से हमारे अध्यापक और अध्यापिकाओं ने हमें पाठ समझाया और लिखवाया। पाठ पढ़ाने के लिए माइक्रोसॉफ्ट टीम, झूम, टीच-मिंट जैसे डिजिटल साधनों की व्यवस्था की गई।

कोविड-19 के वजह से कई स्कूलों को बंद करना पड़ा। शिक्षक वर्ग जो खासगी पाठशालाओं में पढ़ाते थे उनको काम से निकाला गया और उनकी तनखाह 20% कट गई। परिवार चलाने के लिए ये शिक्षक-गण साग सब्जी बेचना, ऑटो चलाना और अन्य कामों में व्यस्त रहने लगे।

कई शिक्षक जिसको कोरोना वारियर्स बना कर काम करना पड़ा था, उनमें से बहुतों की मृत्यु इसी कारण हो गई। पहले कोरोना के हवा में इतना अगवा फैलाया था कि कोरोना से पीड़ित व्यक्ति को

छूने से, देखने से लोग डरने लगते थे। कई अपनों को बचाने के लिए घर, खेत आदि को खो बैठे। कई बच्चे अनाथ हो गए और कई परिवार अपने नौकरियों से हाथ धो बैठे। अभिभावक इस दुविधा में थे कि परिवार का पालन पोषण करूं या बच्चों के भविष्य के लिए धन इकट्ठा करूं।

बदला हुआ सिखाने की तरीका सांप्रदायिक मोड से डिजिटल बन गया तो बहुत सारे माध्यम जैसे टी.वी, रेडियो, ऑनलाइन आदि के जरिए बच्चों को सिखाने की जिम्मेदारी उठाई गई। फिर भी यह ऑनलाइन टी.वी रेडियो और विद्यागम जैसे सिखाने की तरीका सिर्फ बच्चों के मानसिक स्थैर को कुंठित किया। बाहर खेलने वाले बच्चों को घर में बुलाकर उनको मोबाइल एडिक्शन का कारण बना। बहुत से मां-बाप मोबाइल, लैपटॉप तो खरीदा लेकिन नेट-पैक डालने के लिए पैसों का बंदोबस्त नहीं कर पाए। कई मां-बाप अनपढ़ होने के कारण से धीरे-धीरे बच्चे लिखने के, पढ़ने के कौशल से हाथ धो बैठने लगे।

कोरोना महामारी केवल जीवन को मुसीबत में नहीं डाला है बल्कि हमें एक साथ रहने का एक दूसरे की मदद करने का धार्मिक सहिष्णुता का पाठ भी सिखाया है।
